

SOME UPDATES FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend marks the two month anniversary of my arrival at St. Gertrude Parish. In my homilies during my first weekend here, I invited people to share with me their thoughts about the parish, what we do well and what could be improved, and what they are passionate about. Many people

have taken the opportunity to share their thoughts with me, and so I wanted to provide some news and updates on what I've been hearing from you.

OUR NEW PAROCHIAL VICAR

Our new parochial vicar, Father Joachim Kenney, O.P., will be arriving in the middle of next week. I know Father Joachim very well, as he was one of my parochial vicars at my previous parish in New Haven, Connecticut. He grew up in the Dominican parish of St. Louis Bertrand in Louisville,



Kentucky, where his family is still parishioners. I can't wait to have all of you meet him!

FEEDBACK I'VE RECEIVED

Many people shared with me how moved they were by our celebration of Corpus Christi, especially the procession with stops at the three altars. The ice cream social seemed to be a hit as well. I did receive a note from one parishioner who was upset that there was no blessing of fathers at the end of the Mass (as it was also Father's Day). In case any other dads out there were also upset by this, please know there was no intention to slight the fathers present. It was just that, in the midst of the preparations for the procession, the fact it was Father's Day slipped under the radar. I can assure you that next year we will be back to blessing the fathers as always.

My bulletin letter regarding children being welcomed in church received an overwhelming amount of positive feedback, both from young families feeling very supported and from a variety of parishioners of all ages. There were also a few negative comments from people worried about noise in the church. Most of those concerns seemed to be focused on not being able to hear the readings/homily/etc. Indeed, probably the single biggest "complaint" (if you want to call it that) that people have brought up to me during these first two months is the state of the sound system in the church. Along those lines, I'd like to share . . .

UPCOMING PROJECTS

Toward the end of his time as pastor, Father George hired a very well-respected Chicago-based sound engineering company to come to St. Gertrude and do an analysis of the sound system in the church. I have their final report on my desk, which includes a series of recommendations from them on how the sound volume and, more importantly, sound *clarity* in the church can be improved. The next step will be to locate and identify companies capable of making the needed upgrades and getting bids for those upgrades. I will keep everyone informed as things progress. If there is anyone in the parish who has professional training in acoustics, sound engineering, or similar fields who would be willing to help advise me on this, please get in touch with me through the parish office.

Many people have also made me aware that the one lone pew we have set aside in the front right of the church for those in wheelchairs, walkers, et al. is insufficient for the demand we have at some of the Sunday Masses. I have observed this issue myself on multiple occasions and am currently weighing a couple of possible options for how to increase seating for those with limited mobility (and their families). I expect to be able to have a solution in place in the near future.

As always, I welcome your feedback and look forward to the amazing things I know the Lord is calling us to do and to be as a parish over the months ahead!

MEET OUR MINISTRIES: USHERS MINISTRY

St. Gertrude Church has many ministries, programs, and groups for children, youth, and adults—some you may be familiar with and others you may not even know exist. To give you a deeper look into some of these offerings, the St. Gertrude Church bulletin will feature interviews with members of some of these ministries, programs, and groups throughout the year. This month, we're highlighting our ushers ministry.

St. Gertrude Bulletin: What does being an usher at St. Gertrude Church entail?

Ushers: Each Sunday Mass—whether it's the Saturday vigil Mass or the Masses on Sunday—and each holy day Mass has a head usher. The head usher is responsible for making sure collection baskets are in place, confirming whether there is one or two collections, and ensuring there is a total of five ushers available for the collection(s). A few of the ushers greet parishioners and help distribute liturgy programs before Mass and collect them after Mass. A few of the more heavily attended services require an usher or two to assist with seating. A few of the ushers assist with the Communion process to ensure it is orderly and reverent. Ushers also provide help if someone becomes ill during Mass, and they straighten up after Mass.

SGB: How did this ministry get started in the Catholic Church? **Ushers:** The ministry of ushers is the oldest lay ministry in the Catholic Church! According to sources, the doorkeepers of the temple during the time of Christ were the forerunners of today's ushers, but the more immediate predecessor is the clerical order of porter. Instituted in the third century A.D., porters (or ushers) guarded the door of the church against any intruders who might disturb the service. The porter duties were so important that they came to be included in the rite of Ordination, where they were specified as "to ring the bells, open the church and sacristy, and open the book for the preacher." In 1972, Pope Paul VI abolished the order of porter, and this important

SGB: That's fascinating! What is the most challenging aspect of being an usher?

task was given over to the laity.

Ushers: It's very difficult to seat parishioners when the Church is approaching capacity.

SGB: What is the most fulfilling aspect of being an usher? **Ushers:** It can vary for each person, but being of service to the Church and the parishioners at St. Gertrude is very worthwhile.

SGB: Who can be an usher, and how does someone become an usher? **Ushers:** Anyone 16 or older can serve as an usher. All the Masses have a core of regular ushers, but there is always a need for extra help. There are no meetings or special training sessions, and you don't have

to make a commitment for a specific Mass each week. When you arrive for Mass, simply let the head usher know you are available if help is needed. He or she will provide direction. You can also contact Doug Postler at (513) 791-6298 or postman8905@gmail.com if you have any questions or need more information.

SGB: Is there anything else you would like to share about this ministry?

Ushers: One person can't do it all, and there are a few people who deserve to be recognized for their support. Thank you to Megan Runk and Eileen who helped wipe down the pews after every Mass during those first months after COVID. They never hesitated to stay after Mass and never complained! Larry Ball has been Tom Hahn's right-hand man, helping with seating, counting heads, assisting with Communion, and covering for Tom when he wasn't able to make it. David Ball and Tony have been faithful and dependable helpers with the collection each week. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

A PERSONAL WORD FROM SOME OF OUR USHERS

"I have been an usher since the early 1980s. Initially, I was tapped and asked to help on an occasional basis, but by the mid-1980s, I was a regular at the 8 a.m. Sunday Mass, and eventually became the co-head usher at that Mass in the mid-1990s. In the early 2000s, I was tapped by Father Ken to head up the Usher Ministry and have been blessed to work with a number of very dedicated individuals in the Usher Ministry. It's a pleasure and a privilege to provide some assistance at the various services."

"I've been the head usher at the 12 p.m. Sunday Mass since Masses started back after the COVID shutdown in May 2020. Lawain McNeil asked me if I could help and, since I had always attended the 12:30 Mass and am a Knight of Columbus, I thought it would be an appropriate way to give back to the parish. What I enjoy about the role is seeing the regular 12 p.m. Mass goers every week. I feel a little like the shepherd and the people are my sheep; I know them and they know me! I recognize many of the regulars and, if the husband or spouse comes in after the rest of the family, I can usually direct them to where their family is sitting. I know the folks who need a gluten-free host. The other thing I like about the 12 p.m. Mass is that we get the "special" events like the Corpus Christi procession or the sports Masses so there is always a little variety to that Mass."

ASK A PRIEST— THE SACRAMENTS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: Is there official sacramental guidance for parents rearing children with disabilities or for adults who have disabilities?

A: Our Lord Jesus Christ said, "Let the children come to me and do not prevent them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (Mt 19:14).

The Church teaches that the sacraments are the ordinary ways of salvation for God's people. Therefore, Catholics and their pastors receive and administer them as a matter of privilege and duty. Based on his or her own merits, nobody is worthy to receive a participation in God's life. Nevertheless, this is the great possibility of the sacraments. Teaching in Jesus' name, the Church wishes the sacraments to be as open as possible to those who approach them with the right spirit.

The bishops of the United States have offered specific guidelines¹ for administering the sacraments to persons who experience various mental or physical limitations. There are a lot of possibilities to cover, from prenatal diagnoses and physical and cognitive disabilities in children and adults to gluten and wine intolerance. Here are some general principles:

 Approach your parish priest at a mutually convenient time so he can understand your unique needs (or those of a person in your care).

- Those who are properly disposed and ask at an appropriate time have a right to the sacraments. The Church is more accommodating than one might assume for particular disabilities and/or illnesses. Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion should be sought with great solicitude. Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick can be provided for persons who many of us may be tempted to write off and the possible benefits can be great. Marriage and Holy Orders further shape and provide for all Christians as they seek holiness.
- Parishes must work to integrate persons with disabilities into their activities, especially participation in the sacred liturgy and catechesis. This makes a Catholic parish more what it is called to be.

I finish today's column with words from the National Directory for Catechesis: "The Church owes persons with disabilities her best efforts in order to ensure that they are able to hear the Gospel of Christ, receive the sacraments, and grow in their faith in the fullest and richest manner possible." 
