

# WALKING THE JOURNEY TOGETHER

This weekend, all of the parishes in the archdiocese will take up a special second collection, the proceeds of which will go to provide support for the more than 30 pregnancy care centers and related agencies operating in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. This is part of the Commit 2 Women campaign the archdiocese has launched in response to the recent Supreme Court

decision overturning *Roe v. Wade*. Recognizing that more women (and couples) than ever facing an unexpected or unwanted pregnancy may be looking for help, the archbishop has challenged all of the faithful of the archdiocese to be more dedicated to supporting such women and couples than ever before.

The collection at our parish and all other parishes in the archdiocese this weekend is meant to be just the first of many ways in which we are called to rise to this challenge. Our parish has a long history of supporting pregnancy centers and other agencies, both financially and via parishioners who volunteer their time. Our Knights of Columbus council recently conducted an extremely successful fund drive to help purchase an ultrasound machine—something that has been found incredibly important in helping women come to understand the reality of the baby they carry and make the decision for life.

The sharing of our time and financial resources is a very important way in which we commit ourselves to walking the journey together with those facing crisis pregnancies. But there is another very important part of this as well: prayer.

I have worked for many years doing post-abortion counseling, both through Project Rachel and in collaboration with the Sisters of Life. And I can tell you that basically no woman who chooses to end her pregnancy does so out of malice. My experience, and that of so many others who have walked the journey of healing with those who have made this life-shattering decision, is that 99.9 percent of the time someone makes the decision to end a pregnancy because they are shocked, frightened, overwhelmed, even terrified by the fact they are pregnant. Their mind isn't working right, they can't think straight, they feel the entire world is closing in upon them. And in the midst of that emotional crisis, they believe that there is no other possible option, no other choice. They feel trapped and don't see any other way out.

This is where the power of prayer can make a difference. Women and couples facing this onslaught of frightening emotions need to know the peace of Christ. And so I would ask all of you to take a moment sometime this week to pray, and I mean *really* pray—intensely pray—for just one woman or one couple out there that at this very moment is terrified about the baby within. Pray that the peace of Christ, "which surpasses all understanding" (Phil 4:7) might encircle their hearts and minds.

In the weeks and months and years ahead, we are being called by Our Lord to walk this journey of pregnancy with others. By our actions and our prayers, may we do so well and help them to welcome and bring into the world, in peace and joy, the life that has been created. God bless,

# ASK A PRIEST— WHAT MAKES A PARISH DOMINICAN?

FATHER JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

**Q:** I'm fairly new to St. Gertrude Parish, and my previous Catholic parishes were served by diocesan clergy. What characterizes a *Dominican* parish?

A: Good question! Like you, I did not grow up in such a parish, but met the Order of Preachers (hence the O.P. at the end of the names of the Dominican friars and sisters) gradually and in a variety of non-parish contexts. Nevertheless, I hope that these three characteristics resonate with those who have lived and prayed at St. Gertrude Church or another of our Dominican parishes for longer than I:

# 1. The presence (or absence!) of the friars and sisters of the Order of Preachers, i.e. the Dominicans.

It's inspirational to see all the Dominican friars (priests, brothers, and novices) and sisters in such numbers. You have the sense that God is still "up to something" in the Church! But you may return for the same Mass the next week and wonder where half of them have gone! The Dominicans are an *itinerant* Order, geared to move and be moved by the authority of our superiors and for the sake of the preaching mission. Sometimes, this can be like a "shot in the arm," as when a new novice class or a new parochial vicar arrives. At other times, it's more a "shot in the gut," as when a beloved priest or sister is moved to another mission. Either way, parishioners are invited to be part of a spiritual family within the Church that is spread out in time and

space but united in St. Dominic's love for God and zeal for the salvation of souls.

# 2. Solemn celebration of the Church's liturgy supported by theological preaching.

How many Catholics expect to go to church on Good Friday and hear the Gospel sung in threepart harmony? Which of us wasn't refreshed to meet priests and sisters who weren't intimidated or automatically defensive when we raised a tough question in the confessional or classroom? Dominicans love the liturgy, especially the Mass, because it is the privileged place of encounter with the grace of God in Jesus Christ. Hence, we don't rush the prayers and frequently sing them. Concerning the various forms of preaching we undertake (homilies, teaching, spiritual counsel), our prayer life as men and women religious and our theological formation through the tutelage of St. Thomas Aquinas make us humble (in the sense that we are all life-long learners) and confident (the truth is knowable and resonates with the human heart). We have

been convicted by the revelation of God's love for us in Jesus Christ. From this personal experience, we know that God will stop at nothing (always respecting free will, of course) to be Father and friend to every person who hears our preaching. We strive to be preachers of truth and faithful instruments of God's saving grace.

#### 3. The universal call to holiness, taught and embraced.

The spiritual family of which you are invited to be a part of does indeed exceed the limitations of space and time: the Dominican Order has been blessed with many saints in its history. Among these are martyrs, itinerant preachers, cloistered nuns, active sisters, missionaries, and members of lay fraternities. It's our own in-house demonstration of the universal call to holiness, i.e. the teaching that every Christian believer—no matter his or her state in life—is called to radical conversion from sin and intimate friendship with the Lord. The result of Dominican preaching and parish life is not lock-step conformity, but the voluntary use of God's gifts, shared with others. In this life, we are devoted to growing in virtue through the merits of Jesus Christ and the help of the Holy Spirit. This happens through classes and groups of friends in the parish and school, but most of all through individuals who turn their lives over to the Lord in the sacraments. Dominican parish life—with its intense orientation to prayer and fraternal communion and exercise of various giftsforeshadows the fuller life of charity and concord meant for all God's children in heaven.
