The Gospel reading for Mass this weekend is the beginning of Jesus' Bread of Life discourse in John chapter 6. Subsequent weekends are the continuation of this teaching, the proclamation of segments of this important chapter with clear references to the holy Eucharist. I write to encourage every parishioner to read

and pray with this chapter of sacred Scripture. I do so because our liturgical reflection on this chapter will be interrupted in the coming weeks with the celebration of the feast of St. Dominic on August 8, and the celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 15. The interruption means that we will not hear the key verses of Jesus' teaching at Mass.

Our Catholic faith in the real presence of Jesus in the holy Eucharist is paramount to our identity and practice. We learn from the Catechism that "the Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit" (1325). Tragically, there is a current crisis of faith in the Real Presence. Survey after survey presents the data that a large percentage of Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence and regard the Eucharist as a mere symbol. Hence, they do not see the need to attend Mass each week and receive the Lord in holy Communion. To them, and to each of us who do believe, there is the strong urging of the Lord for us to receive him in the sacrament of the Eucharist: "Truly, truly I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you" (In 6:53). In short, we cannot live in the fullness of divine grace and fellowship with the Lord without the sacrament of the Eucharist.

A personal encounter with Jesus awaits us at every moment of holy Communion and is sustained by our life of prayer, devotion, and works of charity. Praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, particularly in eucharistic exposition, prolongs our encounter with Jesus. The Eucharist that we adore comes from the altar at Mass and the graces that we receive from our adoration prepares us for a return to the celebration of the Mass wherein Christ is again received and the soul is filled with grace. The adoration chapel here at our parish gives everyone the opportunity to encounter Jesus who loved us to the end and remains with us always. Here is an insight from Pope St. John Paul II: "The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease" (as quoted in CCC 1380).

Please consider signing up for a regular time for eucharistic adoration in our chapel. Join the many people who have been blessed and enriched in faith and grace through this commitment. More information is found at <u>stgertrude.org/adoration</u>. We will be able to return to perpetual adoration when we have commitments for all the hours of the day and night.

I am happy to share with you that our new parochial vicar, Father Jordan Kelly, has arrived. It is such a blessing to have him here at St. Gertrude, and I look forward to continuing to serve all of you with my fellow Dominican Brother.

Here is a letter of introduction from Father Jordan. I invite you to welcome him and introduce yourselves when you see him at Mass and around campus.

"Let them have dominion" (Gen. 1:26). This is the first desire God expresses for human beings, the part of creation made in his image and likeness. Upon creating

human beings male and female—distinct, complementary, and equal—God issues his next desire in the form of a command: "Be fertile and multiply" (Gen. 1:27).

The Catholic Church upholds the goodness of the marriage covenant and its lifelong bond of fidelity. Respecting the Creator's imperatives for spouses, it champions a spousal love that is free, total, faithful, and fruitful. The Church is a holdout in days dominated by a contraceptive culture and other Christian denominations falling like dominos since the Lambeth Conference in 1930.

In our time, the Church continues to pray for married couples to generously open their fertility to the possibility of God blessing them with the gift of children and endorses numerous natural methods by which couples can exercise a rightful responsibility for their conjugal love in freedom.

David and Ann Stein – Couple to Couple League's Sympto-Thermal Method

Ann and David Stein are certified instructors for the Couple to Couple League International (CCLI) dedicated to helping couples build

healthy marriages and families in accord with the truth of married love. CCLI classes focus on the Sympto-Thermal Method of NFP, the return of fertility after childbirth, and Catholic Church teaching on marriage and sexuality. Jenna Bernardo – Marquette Method

The Marquette Method allows women to test their urinary hormones with the ClearBlue monitor. The monitor reads low, high, or peak fertility, and women use that information, along with protocols and complementary markers, to abstain or conceive a child with

up to 99 percent effectiveness. With the help of a registered nurse, couples can determine their fertility in an objective manner while navigating normal cycles, and especially during postpartum and perimenopause, which are generally confusing phases in cycles. Darcie Hester – Billings Method

My name is Darcie Hester. I'm a wife of two years, a mother of a three-month-old boy, and a certified instructor for the Billings Ovulation Method. Billings focuses on the sensation felt from cervical mucus to help women realize and chart their own unique

pattern of fertility. Using four consistent rules, couples can understand where they are in the woman's cycle and use that knowledge to either achieve or space a pregnancy that month based on their discernment. NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING WEEK, JULY 25-31

NFP is a powerful tool in harmony with God's plan for marriage for engaged couples and married couples to learn how to monitor their reproductive health

and either achieve or postpone pregnancy by practicing periodic abstinence. An NFP course teaches couples how to observe the signs of fertility and apply simple rules to space their children without using drugs or devices. Here in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, we offer NFP courses in a variety of approved methods. Choosing the best method for you and your fiancé(e) or spouse to learn can be tricky if you aren't familiar with the NFP methods. FROM THE DIARY OF ST. MARIA FAUSTINA KOWALSKA

As I usually do, I asked the Lord Jesus one evening to give me the points for next day's meditation. I received the answer: **Meditate on the Prophet Jonah and his mission . . .** I recognized myself in the person of the prophet, in the sense that often I, too, try to make excuses to the Lord, claiming that someone else would do His holy will better than I could, and not understanding that God can do all things and that His omnipotence will be all the more manifest if the tool is poorer . . . I told my confessor that fear seized me because of this mission for which God was using me, clumsy tool that I was, and my spiritual father answered that, willing or not, we must carry out the will of God, and he gave me the Prophet Jonah as an example. ASK A PRIEST DOMINICAN OBEDIENCE

FR. JOHN MARK SOLITARIO, O.P.

Q: The Dominicans strike me as both traditional and intellectually open and engaged. How do friars obey those in authority when their own opinions

and preferences are challenged?

A: The bright lights of the Dominican Order teach us that adherence to Tradition and freedom of thought and action are not necessarily opposed. The Catechism treats Tradition not as something stagnant but "living." Guided by the Holy Spirit, the Church obtains deeper knowledge and clearer teaching regarding what has been "handed on" from the Apostles. For example, the books of the New Testament were composed after Jesus ascended into Heaven, thanks to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. The same Spirit continues to assist the Church with the interpretation of that written Word today.

Jesus promised true freedom to those who accepted the truth from his lips (see Jn 8:32). There can be no real flourishing for any man or woman without faithfulness. The pope and bishops have the responsibility to see that sacred Tradition, both written and spoken, is passed on fully to Christians today so that they can know and love the truth that completes them. In performing this task, the Church's pastors are not to domineer but to serve the Word.³ Individual Christians, too, are called to explore God's revelation in a spirit of faithfulness through contemplation and study and even theological research. Given their imitation of Jesus who was always obedient to his Father, the overall approach of the Church is one of adventure: "Thanks to the supernatural sense of faith, the people of God as a whole never cease to welcome, penetrate more deeply, and live more fully from the gift of divine revelation."

The Dominican charism presupposes obedience. In our vow formula, obedience is the only virtue that is named: to God, Mary, St. Dominic, and various elected superiors and their successors as specified in our Constitutions and Rule. Obedience is meant to ensure that all the friars—from the youngest novice to the Master of the Order—remain united to the spirit and mission: preaching for the salvation of souls. Singularity and self-pursuit undermine our preaching of Jesus Christ, whose Spirit of truth, love, and peace we have been called to "put on." Short of asking a brother to sin or transgress the laws of the Church or Dominican Order, our superiors are given the benefit of the

doubt and, according to the Rule of St. Augustine, pitied and prayed for given their great responsibilities. We elected them, after all! We may disagree with them and perhaps their faults are quite visible, but certain decisions—all consultation said and done—are theirs to make and ours to follow.
