### MAKING EVERY HOME A BETHANY

Just over two years ago, the Vatican's Congregation for Divine Worship issued a decree, approved by Pope Francis, that made a subtle but important change to one of the memorials on our liturgical calendar. Until recently, the memorial we celebrate on July 29, which falls this weekend, was

the Memorial of St. Martha. Now it is instead called the Memorial of Sts. Martha, Mary, and Lazarus.

These three siblings lived together in a home in Bethany, just a few miles outside of Jerusalem. We know from the Gospels that Jesus would stay in their house from time to time. The most extended description of one of these stays is the famous incident recorded in Luke 10:38-42, where Martha was "burdened with much serving" while Mary sat at Jesus' feet listening to him and was praised for choosing the "better part." But there are other references to Jesus staying in Bethany as well. The most significant of these is recorded in Matthew 21:17, where Jesus chooses to spend the night there on the eve of his final entry into Jerusalem . . . the entry into Jerusalem that would culminate with his passion and crucifixion. Now, while that particular passage doesn't say explicitly Jesus stayed in the house of Martha and her siblings, it is most logical to presume that he did. We know Jesus was extremely close with them; during the account of the resurrection of Lazarus (John 11), Jesus refers to Lazarus as his friend. Moreover, in that same incident, we are told directly, "Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus" (Jn 11:5) and learn that Jesus weeps when he arrives at Lazarus' tomb. All of the evidence of the Gospels is that Jesus had a very close and personal relationship with this family, which without doubt developed as a result of the time Jesus spent in their home as a guest. Their hospitality, in welcoming Jesus into their home in Bethany, blossomed into deep friendship and authentic love.

The same can be true of us. Whether our home is a small apartment or a majestic mansion, whether we live alone or are in the midst of family life, whether we are students just beginning to live away from home or the elderly in a retirement community... all of us can transform our living space into a "Bethany." We can welcome and invite others to come over. We can open our homes to family and friends. We can invest ourselves in "serving" our guests, and in doing so, show them honor and care—and most of all, love. It doesn't have to be dramatic; inviting a neighbor over for coffee or tea is enough. Not all of us are "social butterflies" comfortable hosting large parties. Indeed, not all of our "Bethanys" are large enough to handle huge crowds! But in some way, however small, we can all reach out and invite others in.

May the example of Sts. Martha, Mary, and Lazarus and their home in Bethany, be an inspiration to us all. For when we welcome others into our homes in a spirit of true hospitality, we also welcome in Christ himself. God bless,



#### **DOMINICAN ROSARY PILGRIMAGE NOVENA**





Therefore, a 'yes' vote on Issue 1 will make it more difficult to pass any future amendment to the Constitution of Ohio, including this November's ballot initiative seeking an abortion rights constitutional amendment that expands and enshrines abortion at the expense of protections of preborn children and women. A 'no' vote on Issue 1 will maintain the current threshold, making it easier to pass an amendment to Ohio's constitution, including the one coming this November on the abortion expansion amendment."

# ASK A DEACON - THE DOMINICAN HABIT

Q: What are the parts of the Dominican habit, and what are their significance?

**A:** This is actually a great time to ask this question since, just this past Saturday, seven young men arrived who will be receiving the

Dominican habit and beginning their novitiate nine days from now on the feast of St. Dominic (August 8). Please keep these men in your prayers as they begin to learn the practical ins and outs of wearing, walking in, and laundering this unique and beautiful sign of their vocations.

The habit, of course, is what we call the distinctive clothing which we wear as religious. Other kinds of religious have their own habits, for instance Franciscan friars or the Missionaries of Charity founded by Mother Teresa.

For all religious, the habit functions as an external sign of their consecration to God. It is a reminder to both ourselves and others that we have been called to give our entire lives to God in a special way according to the way of life given to us by our founders. Because it is such a striking, visible sign, the habit is also a great conversation starter. People often feel compelled to ask, "What are you?" which provides an opportunity for evangelization.

The first layer of the Dominican habit is a white tunic. It starts with a collar and extends to our ankles and has full length sleeves as well. The white color of the tunic and other white parts of the habit indicates purity of life with Christ. Originally, the friars wore wool habits and, rather than being strictly "white," the habit was simply the light color of undyed wool. This made it cheaper, in keeping with the poverty of our way of life.

The belt is meant to be a reminder of our vow of chastity. According to legend, St. Thomas Aquinas was girded with a belt by two angels after defending his chastity against a temptation arranged for by his brothers who wished to hinder his vocation.

We wear a rosary on the left side of our belt, where a knight's sword traditionally hung. The rosary is among the most important weapons we can have in spiritual warfare. Additionally, the promotion of prayer and contemplation through the use of the rosary has been an important part of Dominican preaching, as depicted in the well-known legend of the Blessed Mother appearing to St. Dominic and giving him the first rosary.

Over our belt and over our shoulders goes a strip of white fabric about shoulder width that hangs down the front and the back of our tunic. This is the scapular and, just like the small scapulars that many Catholics wear, it is a sign of our consecration to the Blessed Mother. The very first Dominicans did not have this as part of their habit, but rather wore a surplice over their tunics (this is the roughly waist length garment that altar servers wear over the cassock). That was the dress

of the canons (monks attached to a cathedral). Since St. Dominic had previously been a canon, it makes sense that this is what the very first friars wore. Eventually, the Blessed Mother appeared to Blessed Reginald of Orleans, one of St. Dominic's early followers, as he lay dangerously ill with a fever. She healed him and revealed to him the complete habit of the Orderwith the scapular replacing the surplice. The scapular is the only part of the habit that is formally blessed, and we all treasure that Our Lady personally intervened to make this sign of consecration to her a part of the clothes we wear every day.

Over the scapular goes the capuce, a kind of shoulder cape with a rounded hood. The hood is useful for protecting our heads from the cold, the sun, and the rain. It can also limit our peripheral vision and help us not to be distracted by other things happening around us when we are praying. The part of the capuce covering the shoulders may also have been intended to allude to the shoulder cape often worn by bishops at that time. As preachers, the Dominicans share in the preaching office of the bishop, which was especially significant during the time of our founding when very few diocesan priests preached.

Over all this goes our black cappa or cape. The cappa also has its own black capuce or hooded shoulder cape, just like the white one, which goes on top of everything else as the last layer. This was traditionally worn both for warmth and as a sign of penance. Since the medieval church practiced penance for a significant portion of the colder months of the year, these two purposes could be achieved at the same time. There is even a kind of poetic symbolism in the fact that our white garments, which signify purity, are covered by the black cappa (when it is worn), which signifies penance and mortification. The practice of penance is indeed one of the very best ways to protect the purity of our hearts. It is because of our black cappas that the Dominicans are traditionally known in the English-speaking world as the blackfriars. The entire ensemble also looks really really cool so, frequently, when on a preaching mission or attending a formal event, friars will wear the entire habit, including the cappa.


