Even though St. Gertrude is a Family of one and not joining with any other parishes in the archdiocese, the Church principle—"Each of us is called to

actively participate as a member of a parish, the Universal Church and our local Church"—still applies to our parish. I encourage you to read the article and strive to live out this principle.

BEACONS OF LIGHT FOUNDATIONAL PRINCIPLES #3: THE CHURCH LOCAL AND UNIVERSAL

What does it mean to be a member of a church? The answer lies in how we define the word "church."

In its most basic sense, "church" can simply refer to the building in which we celebrate the Mass and



other sacraments. At a slightly higher level, it can be another form of the word "parish." For example, "What church do you go to?" "I'm a member of Our Lady of Victory."

We must remember, however, that our baptism makes us members of a very special "Church" – the Catholic Church. This is the Church founded by Jesus Christ, formed by the Apostles and handed on to every successive generation for 2,000 years. Our local church does not exist independently, but is in union with the Universal Church under the authority of our archbishop and the leadership of the Holy Father. In the context of Beacons of Light, each of these aspects of "church" has a special role: Church as a sacred space, Church as a local parish, Church as Christ's universal body. The core principle for Church, as set forth by the Beacons of Light, incorporates all these elements: "Each of us is called to actively participate as a member of a parish, the Universal Church and our local Church, led by our archbishop. Parishes continually deepen the bonds of communion with other parishes."

Our Families of Parishes will rely upon each other for success, recognizing the heritage of our past and embracing a common future. Several goals will make this possible.

THE LOCAL CHURCH IS ORGANIZED INTO DEANERIES:

Our archdiocesan church operates effectively by dividing into regional deaneries. Our new canonical parishes (i.e., "Families of Parishes") will continue to follow that organizational model and benefit through the interdependency of each parish with the other.

ARCHDIOCESAN COMMUNION WITH THE UNIVERSAL CHURCH: In communion with the Holy Father, the archbishop exercises leadership in the local Church.

EMBRACING SUBSIDIARITY: One of the Church's foundational social teachings is subsidiarity, which states that matters ought to be handled by the smallest, lowest or least centralized competent authority, and higher authorities should provide assistance to the lower authorities when appropriate. This enables decisions to be made at the local level wherever possible. Deaneries enhance regional subsidiarity, operating on a local level, which empowers Families of Parishes to cooperate with each other in all forms of ministry.

RESPECTING CULTURE AND HISTORY: In one Family of Parishes, the culture and history of our individual parishes are acknowledged, honored and, where possible, preserved. Efforts seek to blend cultural and historical differences with compassion and compromise.

RECOGNIZING LOCAL & UNIVERSAL MEMBERSHIP:

The People of God understand that the parish comprises the people within a given territory, and therefore, they grow in understanding themselves as members of Christ's Body, the Church.

We should not lose sight of the fact that our churches were brought together into Families of Parishes. This is an intentional designation. Families pray together, share their lives with each other, encourage each other and celebrate together. Just as we nourish and sustain our own families, we should strive to do likewise for our new parish family. Pray for the success of our priests, our parishes' staffs and our brother and sister parishioners. Share in each other's joys, sorrows, struggles and dreams. Encourage one another in our personal and spiritual growth. Celebrate our parishes' similarities and differences, brought together in our common Catholic faith.

Lumen Gentium, Vatican II's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, tells us "The universal Church is seen to be 'a people brought into unity from the unity of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit." As Church, we are the Body of Christ. As members of that Body, we are on the journey of faith together — as one body, united in the Holy Trinity, for the good of our local church and the Universal Church. Our confidence rests in God that our parishes will truly come together as one family, one Church.

(TRYING TO) LIVE THE MISSION: SILENCE IS GOLDEN

"If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts" (Psalm 95:7-8).

Within each of us, there is a desire to hear God speak. Surely, I'm not alone in this. In times of transition and confusion, I want to know what the Almighty has planned for my life. My heart longs to hear his loving voice when I am anxious or afraid. As I live my daily life, I want to know that I am doing his will and am found well-pleasing in his sight. My mind grapples with the complexities of our fragile world and wonders how the many problems will be solved and how and when healing will come to the suffering and brokenhearted. We seek the consolation and presence of our loving Father.

How do we attune our hearts to "hear his voice" amidst the hurried pace of our culture? How do we quiet our minds to rest in his goodness and love when evil seems close at hand?

I don't have answers to those questions; I am with you on the journey, seeking the voice of the Lord. But what I do see very clearly in my own life is the need for *silence*.

We all know that, in communicating with others, it is often difficult and frustrating to dialogue with someone who is only half-listening. When the other is watching TV, listening to music, scrolling on their phone, etc., we know that we are not being heard. The stories from the day that we want to share are not appreciated by one who is not fully present.

Hopefully, we have all experienced the opposite: the blessing of conversations that move our hearts. There are those moments of deep communication where it seems as if time has stopped. We feel secure in the others' loving presence. We trust that we are known, understood, and loved.

Could we draw a parallel to the communication with God that we call prayer? How often am I "scrolling through" my list of things to do, instead of listening to my Lord? How often am I busily going about my day, and not aware of God's whispers of tenderness and love? Like the man in the Gospel parable today, am I making plans for myself without seeking God and surrendering to him?

For a couple weeks this month, I was asked to do "farm sitting"—feed and tend to the animals on my friends' property (cows, roosters, chickens, pigs, ducks, sheep, goats, a dog, and cats). There was a lot to do, as the animals depended on me for their food and water for the day (except the sheep—they ate the grass in the pasture and drank from the pond). As I went about the chores, though, I was struck by the simplicity and silence of being there. No phone calls or text messages while filling the cow trough or collecting the eggs. No music blaring by passing cars as I tossed the hay to the goats. I found beautiful silence in doing work with my hands, and in the silence I could listen to what was in my own heart . . . and strive to listen to the voice of the Lord.

In returning from those peaceful days at the farm, I've been mindful of the need to set aside time for silence. Taking those quiet moments in the morning before checking the phone, beginning my work day with prayer, pausing for an examination of conscience as the day ends—these are essential moments of silence. These are moments when I can give my heart to the Lord, and remember that God is actually *always* with me. He softens my heart and sows the seed of his word, and his voice is one of love.

ASK A PRIEST— AUGUST PREVIEW

FATHER JOACHIM KENNEY, O.P.

Q: What are the Church holy days that we can look forward to in August?

A: Those hoping for slow and relaxing dog days of summer better think again, at least liturgically. August is chock-full of feast

days of notable saints, both ancient and modern. There are two predominant flavors to the month: Marian and Dominican. But there are a number of other important feasts, as well. Not everyone I mention will actually be celebrated this year because some of them fall on Sunday and some are optional.

A word about the ranking of liturgical days might be helpful for what follows. The term "feast day" denotes the day that a saint is specially celebrated by the Church. To confuse matters a bit though, feast days are ranked according to importance, and "feast" is one of the rankings. Here are the rankings, highest to lowest:

- 1. Solemnity (S)
- 2. Feast (F)
- 3. Memorial (M)
- 4. Optional Memorial (OM).

Two solemnities highlight this month. The greatest holy day of August is the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (S) on August 15. On this day, we celebrate Mary's being taken up, body and soul, into heaven when her time on Earth was completed. The other Marian feast days are the Dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary Major (OM) on August 5 and the Queenship of Mary (M), celebrating the crowning of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth (the fifth glorious mystery of the rosary) on August 22.

Three other saints add something to the Marian flavor of the month: St. Alphonsus Liguori (M) on August 1, St. Maximilian Kolbe





(M) on August 14, and St. Bernard of Clairvaux (M) on August 20. All are noted for their eloquent writings on the Blessed Mother, amongst their other distinctions.

The other solemnity is that of St. Dominic on August 8. Most of the Church celebrates that day as a memorial, but for Dominicans, it gets elevated because he is our founder. St. Augustine (F), in addition to being one of the greatest doctors of the Church, is also a "Father" to Dominicans since he wrote the Rule we follow. He is celebrated on August 28. This month, the Order of Preachers also celebrates St. Dominic's mother, Blessed Jane of Aza (OM) on August 2 and his brother, Blessed Mannes (OM) on August 18. Other feast days that contribute to the month's Dominican flavor are St. Hyacinth (M) on August 17 and St. Rose of Lima (M) on August 23. St. Hyacinth was brought into the Order by St. Dominic himself and evangelized Poland and other eastern and northern European areas. St. Rose was a Third Order Dominican and is one of the great saints of the Americas.

The Transfiguration of the Lord (F) on August 6 is the most important non-solemnity of the month. Other big days are St.

Lawrence (F) on August 10 and St. Bartholomew (F) on August 24. St. Lawrence was a deacon and possibly the most humorous martyr of the early Church. He was roasted alive over a fire and at one point quipped to his persecutors that they could turn him over because he was done on the one side.

Other notable saints include St. John the Baptist (M); St. Jeanne Jugan (OM), who founded the Little Sisters of the Poor; St. John Vianney (M), the patron of parish priests; St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (OM), who died in a concentration camp in World War II; St. Monica (M), the mother of St. Augustine; St. Clare (M); St. Helena (OM), who discovered the True Cross; and Pope St. Pius X (M), who, in the early 1900s, encouraged the faithful to frequent reception of Holy Communion.


