

The Assumption August 15, 2022

On August 15, we celebrate the greatest holy day of the month: the Assumption of Mary. Since this solemnity falls on Monday this year, it is not a holy day of obligation. We still invite you to join us for Mass at 7 a.m., 8 a.m., 11:30 a.m. (also the Mass of Profession), or 7 p.m.





TO PROFESS VOWS

"I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship" (Romans 12:1).

This Monday, August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the nine men who have been novices with us this past year will make their simple (that

is, temporary) profession of vows. As such, they will become joined to the Order of Preachers—not merely by the habit they wear or by the place where they live, but by a promise made to God, to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and to our father and founder, St. Dominic. It is a vow that will be received by the prior provincial of our Dominican Province of St. Joseph, who does so "standing in" for the master of the Order, who is the modern-day successor of St. Dominic.

These nine men will be embodying, in quite a literal sense, what St. Paul was urging in the above passage in the letter to the Romans. Before the brothers are called up one by one to make their profession of vows, the provincial will ask them what they seek. Just as St. Paul emphasized that such an offering is made "by the mercies of God," the brothers will respond with the words, "God's mercy and yours." No man (or woman) should ever deign to embark upon the vowed religious life without recognizing their need—indeed, their utter dependence—upon the mercy of God. And given the reality that all of us are flawed sinners, no one should ever embark upon religious life without realizing they will have much need to ask the mercy and forgiveness of their brethren . . . and that they, in turn, will need to constantly extend mercy and forgiveness as well. "I will pay my vows to the Lord, in the presence of all his people . . ." (Psalm 116:18).

Beginning on Monday, these men take upon themselves a solemn obligation. Having promised to God that they will live their vows, the task now falls upon them to do so "in the presence of all his people." This is the public witness of religious life. Even fully cloistered, contemplative religious provide a "public" witness in their religious life. Much more so do those religious who are in the world. Beyond any concrete ministries or apostolates which they might perform during the years ahead, the novices' very presence in the midst of God's peace is itself a critical facet of their vocation as religious friars. "As a consecration of the whole person, religious life manifests in the Church a wonderful marriage brought about by God, a sign of the future age. Thus the religious brings to perfection a total self-giving as a sacrifice offered to God, through which his or her whole existence becomes a continuous worship of God in charity" (Code of Canon Law, n. 607).

As living icons of the world yet to come, where "God will be all in all" (1 Cor 15:28), vowed religious points to the primacy of a life lived in love of God. This "worship of God in charity," in the form of a total giving of self and laying down of one's life, lies at the heart of the vows our novices will profess on Monday. May God, who has begun this good work in them, bring it to completion.

Everyone in the parish is invited to attend their Profession Mass at 11:30 a.m. on Monday. Whether you are able to attend or not, please keep these men in your prayers as they offer themselves as a living sacrifice to God.

ASK A DEACON—THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION

BROTHER MICHAEL DONAHUE, O.P.

Q: The solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is coming up on Monday, August 15. Why is this feast so important to the Dominican friars?

A: First, it would be good to recall what the Church celebrates on the solemnity of the Assumption. It is a day when we celebrate a particular facet of the Blessed Virgin Mary's life. As Catholics, we believe that Mary was immaculately conceived-that is, conceived without original sin-so that she could be the Immaculate Mother of God. Since Mary has been given this great privilege by God, we also hold that she was given a further privilege: that "having completed the course of her earthly life, [she] was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."¹ Rather than only Mary's soul going to heaven, God took her body to heaven, as well! She was given this great privilege after the pattern of her Son, Jesus, who bodily ascended into heaven 40 days after his resurrection. Mary's assumption into heaven also foreshadows what will happen at the end of time with the resurrection of the body. On the last day, God will raise up our bodies and join them, once again, to our souls. On the solemnity of the Assumption, we therefore celebrate the great privileges given to our Blessed Mother, and we also look forward in hope to what will happen to each of us at the end of time.

The Assumption of Mary is a great feast day in the life of the whole Church, and in itself is a cause for great rejoicing and celebration. However, there are several reasons why this feast day is also quite important to the Dominican friars. The first is that the Dominican Order has long been under the patronage of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We look to her as a special intercessor and protectress for our Order. Thus, on the Assumption, we gratefully recall Mary's intercession and protection as we commemorate her entry into heaven.

The second reason is that the solemnity of the Assumption marks the anniversary of a special day in the history of the Dominican Order. By August of 1217, less than eight months after it had been officially established, the Order of Preachers still consisted of a small band of friars. Rather than remain in Prouille, France, St. Dominic decided that it would be better to disperse the band of 16 men across Europe to the various centers of learning. While some of the brethren thought this would harm the fledgling Order, St. Dominic realized that sending men to study in the universities and to preach there would only help the Order of Preachers to grow. On August 15, 1217, St. Dominic dispersed his brothers to Paris, Spain, Toulouse, Prouille, and Rome, which led to the rapid expansion and establishment of the Dominican Order in just a few short years.

The solemnity of the Assumption is not only important to the entire Dominican Order, but also to the friars of our province, the Province of St. Joseph. There is a long tradition in our province of concluding the novitiate year on the Assumption. Each year on August 15, the novices profess simple vows into the hands of our prior provincial—the superior of our province. At that point, these brothers officially become members of the Dominican Order, bound by the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. It is a great blessing and joy to be able to profess simple vows in an Order under Mary's patronage on one of her great feast days, and it is something that every member of our province fondly remembers.

On Monday, the solemnity of the Assumption, nine novices who have spent the last year at St. Gertrude Church will profess their simple vows at the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Please keep them in your prayers as they move on to Washington, D.C., to begin their academic studies for the priesthood!
