FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



TRANSITIONING FROM SUMMER TO FALL

(INCLUDING A REQUEST FROM THE PASTOR)

This past week has been a busy one indeed! On Tuesday, the solemnity of Our Lady's assumption, we had the joy of celebrating the first profession of vows for

our 12 novices who have been with us this past year. Thursday was the first day of school for all of our students attending St. Gertrude School, with other local schools starting this week as well. And then, this Saturday evening is the annual parish picnic—a special centennial celebration this year with tons of food (a full pig roast), lots of games for the children, and live music. For those reading this letter sometime before Saturday, I do hope you are able to come and share in the joy of this event with your fellow parishioners.

These three events, which historically all fall during the same week, collectively mark the end of summer and the beginning of fall for our St. Gertrude Parish community. And with that transition, we also are seeing some "goings and comings" among those who serve at the parish. With the summer ending, the time has come for our two "summer help" clergy to return to Washington, D.C., to continue their studies. Having Father Brendan and our deacon Brother Christopher with us was truly a joy. I hope you agree that their ministry and presence at our parish these past few months was truly a great gift to our community. And at the same time, I can say without any doubt that the witness of faith, joy, and love that the two of them experienced from our parishioners made a profound impact upon them. Both of them were effusive in the way they spoke about the effect that being here at St. Gertrude had on them. So I would like to thank all of you—our amazing parishioners—for embracing them the way you did this summer.

This is also a time of year when we tend to see a higher number of new faces in the parish. Last month alone, we had 13 new households register as parishioners! And just in the past week, I have personally met two families who are newly-arrived and just joined the parish. So during the weeks ahead, as your pastor, *I am asking every single member of the parish* to keep your eyes open for new faces. If you see someone you don't recognize, go out of your way to say hello and introduce yourself. It is my hope that every first-time visitor to our parish experiences a warm welcome, not only from our priests and parish staff, but also from all of you. And I have to say, very few things warm my pastor's heart more than seeing new individuals or families being embraced and warmly welcomed when they first come to St. Gertrude.

Finally, I wanted to share that, for a little over a month, we are going to be without Father Joachim. As some of you may know, over the past year, he has applied to become a chaplain in the Naval Reserves. Toward the end of next week, he will be departing for

Navy Officer Development School which is located at Naval Station Newport (Rhode Island), where he will undergo a five-week period of initial training as a Navy officer. He will finish that and return to St. Gertrude sometime around September 29. So please join me in praying for his safety as he travels and undergoes this period of training. During the time he is away, Father Luke and myself will be doing the work of three, which means that, with the extra sacramental duties that will be on our plates, we may not be able to get to some of our non-sacramental responsibilities as quickly as usual. So if we seem slow to return an email or a phone call or to get to a project we thought we would be able to finish, at least you will know the reason why. Please know we will be doing our best!

The beginning of fall is an exciting time around St. Gertrude. May our hearts be fully open to the graces the Lord surely will be showering upon us during the weeks and months ahead. God bless,





Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On November 7, 2023, Ohioans will have the opportunity to demonstrate how our state views the sacredness of life and the dignity of women. On the November ballot will be a proposed amendment (deceptively named "The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety") to the Ohio Constitution that would enshrine the "right" to take the lives of innocent children in the womb while harming women and families in the process.

An expectant mother of any age can face many challenges, including lack of support from the father, financial strains, concerns about her own health and that of her child, and pressures from family and friends. Every woman, regardless of circumstances, should be able to depend upon a community of support. That is why Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with many other faith-based and secular organizations, assist pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment, both during pregnancy and after their child is born.

By contrast, the proposed amendment does none of that. If enacted, it would amend the Constitution of Ohio to effectively:

- *Put women at risk.* This amendment would enable elimination of some of the most basic, fundamental safety regulations on abortion clinics, including the current requirement for an abortion to be performed by a licensed physician.
- *Threaten parental rights.* The vague language in the amendment opens the door to anyone under 18 having an abortion, or even beginning cross-sex hormone treatment, without parental consent or notification.
- *Allow abortion through 9 months of pregnancy.* The amendment provides caveats such that a healthy, fully-formed infant in the womb who otherwise could be delivered with no issues would still be a candidate for a surgical dismemberment abortion.

We must reject this extraordinary and dangerous attempt to radically reshape Ohio through a constitutional amendment that does nothing to aid women or promote life.

The amendment's supporters will claim that its passage is necessary to preserve medical treatment for women who experience miscarriages or ectopic pregnancies. This is not true. No Ohio laws – or the laws of any U.S. state, for that matter – prevent such treatment. Hospitals, including Catholic hospitals, and physicians have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care, and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

Some may insist that the Catholic Church should not be involved in politics. However, the defense of life and care for women compels our participation in this critical moral issue. As Catholics, we are morally obliged to uphold the dignity of life of all vulnerable humans – immigrants, the poor, preborn children. We cannot remain silent on a direct ballot question like the one in November. The Church must not remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life and dignity and the primacy of the family.

Ohio does not need a constitutional amendment that only perpetuates violence and a culture of death. I urge Catholics and all people of goodwill to pray earnestly for the defeat of this extreme amendment; to educate yourselves and your family and friends about the dangers of the proposed amendment; and to vote NO on November 7. Beyond that, we must continue our commitment to caring for women, children and families.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, mother of our Lord and Savior, and St. Joseph, protector of the family, intercede for Ohio and its families in the weeks ahead.


