# CENTENNIAL EVENTS: A RECAP AND A LOOKING **FORWARD**

It's been roughly nine months since Archbishop Christopher Cardone, O.P., came to celebrate the opening Mass for our year of preparation for our parish centennial. Since that time, we have had a slew of events. Last fall, we had the inaugural Vigil

of the Saints prayer service, an evening with a Ukrainian refugee family that came to tell their story, and the Visions of Eternity recital by Dr. Holman with organ music spanning the history of the Church. This past spring, we had the all-parish Mardi Gras potluck, the Vigil Project's True Presence Night, and the viewing of *The Chosen* with special guest appearance by actor Jonathan Roumie. And this summer, we welcomed internationally acclaimed Catholic author and speaker George Weigel, expanded our Corpus Christi procession (which gained national media coverage), and celebrated a special centennial pig roast version of the parish picnic just last weekend.

There are only a few events left between now and the end of our year of preparation. In September, we have our father/son event, #Unbreakable, which will include games, a talk by a Cincinnati Bengals Hall of Famer, and food. (Side note for the ladies: There is an archdiocesan co-sponsored mother/daughter event that is happening at St. Gertrude later this fall, and there is also talk among some of the moms of the parish of putting together something similar to #Unbreakable for the girls at some point in the future. Stay tuned!)

Then, early in November, we have our Centennial Gala at the Manor House in Mason. This will be a formal evening including an open bar appetizer hour, a nice multi-course meal, raffle, auction, and swing dancing. Unlike every single centennial event we have had so far, which have all been completely free to attend, this one has a ticket price. (And yes, a substantial one.) The reason for that is pretty simple: this event is a fundraiser. Note that there are still only a few days left to buy tickets at the discounted price; September 1 the price goes up to the standard price for tickets.

The Centennial Gala committee has been working with me over these past months to brainstorm ways in which the funds raised by the Gala could truly help support St. Gertrude Parish and provide both needed assistance and something very special. I am happy to share publicly, for the first time, some of the results of this brainstorming. In the area of needed assistance, one very important common space used by so many church and school activities is our Parish Center. Yet, some of the space in that building is in bad need of upgrading; two areas in particular are the restrooms and the kitchen. The modernizing of those spaces will be one of the key benefits of the Gala income.

And then, the very special project. As the centennial committee began meeting about a year ago, it was noted, that while there are beautiful statues of the Blessed Mother, St. Gertrude, and St. Therese on our grounds, there is no statue of St. Dominic—despite the fact that Dominican friars have served this parish for nearly a century and the Dominican sisters have served here since the opening of St. Gertrude School in the 1930s. So, I

am happy to announce that we have decided it is time to change this oversight. Some of the funds generated by the Gala will be used to commission and install a life-sized statue of St. Dominic outside near the entrance to the church. This statue will serve as a testimony to the dedication of the friars and sisters who have served at St. Gertrude so faithfully for so many decades and as an inspiration to both present and future generations of parishioners and school children to imitate the example of holiness, virtue, and apostolic zeal for truth and the salvation of souls reflected in the life of St. Dominic.

Finally, our celebrations will reach their finale with the Mass and Procession on St. Gertrude's Feast Day (November 16), where we will welcome Archbishop Schurr as our Mass celebrant and homilist, followed by the all-parish centennial party, which will happen the following Saturday (November 18) in the gym. As in years past, these events will be family-friendly and free of charge.

It has been an amazing road so far, and the best is yet to come. I hope you are all as excited as I am about what lies ahead of us between now and the end of November! God bless,



# BECOME CATHOLIC— IT CHANGED MY LIFE

Hi! My name is Chris Nagle, a new Catholic as of this past Easter! I would like to share my testimony—my experience with the Become Catholic program—and how becoming Catholic has changed my life.

At the age of 12, I accepted Jesus as my Savior and was baptized in the Lutheran church. Sadly, for the next 26 years, I had only preconceived notions of the Catholic Church, judging the faith without truly understanding what Catholics believe and why.

Almost exactly one year ago, someone sent me a fascinating interview of a former satanist who had a radical conversion to the Catholic faith. While his conversion story was nothing short of incredible, it was his perspectives and convictions that really caught my ear. Those convictions had me question what I thought of Catholicism and, from that moment, I decided to objectively examine the Catholic faith. I started to read books, listen to podcasts, read articles—you name it.

During my exploring phase, I spoke to a longtime friend about my curiosity and journey. As a parishioner of St. Gertrude Church, he recommended I check out the church and go to a Mass. I contacted the church and met with Father Joachim Kenney who was not only gracious with his time, but also patient in answering my questions. This not only impressed me, but also drew me to attend Mass at St. Gertrude.

After two to three months of reading, questioning, and attending Mass, I enrolled in Become Catholic in December (a little late to the program, but they welcomed me with open arms!). I have to admit that the first time I attended, I was a little nervous. Let's be honest, sometimes the Catholic Church can be intimidating to a



non-Catholic. Would the priest(s) understand my situation? What would people think of me? What if I voiced my opinion and we disagreed? What if people judged me? My experience was actually the opposite. Everyone in the program (it's not just the priest, there are sponsors and others curious about the faith) welcomed me with open arms, answered *all* my questions, and engaged in conversation without judgment. I especially have to give thanks to my sponsor, Ryan Schilling, who met with me multiple times outside of the class to discuss and answer my questions.

The more I attended Mass and attended Become Catholic, the deeper peace I felt. I knew I was diving into a beautiful tradition of which I was only scratching the surface. It had become more obvious to me as to why Catholic and not Protestant. My faith was taking deeper roots than it had ever before and got me excited about what was to come. It's about learning, but even more importantly, it is about gaining confidence and trust that you are committed to Catholic teaching and way of life.

I still have so much more to learn as a new Catholic, but I cannot emphasize enough the peace I now experience. My daughters attend Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS), and one will start classes for First Communion. It is an exciting journey ahead for my family and me, and I hope to meet you soon.



# ASK AN EXPERT—WHAT'S REALLY AT STAKE

PHILIP WILLIAMSON, PARISHIONER AND PRO-LIFE ATTORNEY

**Q:** I've heard that the proposed abortion ballot initiative for the November election uses vague terms and sly language so that the average voter wouldn't really understand the

implications if this amendment is passed. What do Ohioans need to look out for?

**A:** The proposed amendment *is* vague and deceptive—on purpose. And it has a lot of moving parts. But if you ask two questions for each section of the amendment, the whole thing will make a lot more sense: "who?" and "what?"

The first section (section A), sets up the "right" to an abortion. It states that "every individual has the right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion." What is the point of the list of rights? It is to smuggle abortion in with things you already have the right to do. Now, there are certainly things on the list that Catholics *should not* do; the Church's teaching on contraception is clear. But you have always had the right to carry your baby to term. You have always had the right to miscarriage care. The only *new* right in this amendment is abortion. The pro-abortionists want you to think you have to say yes to abortion in order to say yes to keeping your baby. That just isn't true.

The next section (section B) tells us how far that abortion right goes. Wrapped in a lot of legalese, that section says that the State cannot "burden" or "interfere with" either an "individual's" decision to get an abortion, or with any "person or entity" who helps her do so. So who does this section protect? An "individual" is not just an adult. Pro-abortionists think that minors should be able to have abortions, and you can be sure that's how they will read "individual." And what about the "person or entity" who helps? Most obviously that would include the abortionist and abortion clinic.

You should also know what a "burden" is. In the 50 years since *Roe v. Wade*, courts have described a lot of things as "burdens" on abortion: Parental consent and parental notification laws, waiting periods, informed consent requirements, and even clinic safety and reporting requirements. All of these things would be forbidden under the proposed amendment.

Section B also says that the State can prohibit abortion after viability, but that the State cannot prohibit any abortion at any time if "in the judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician," the abortion is necessary to preserve the mother's life or health. Well, who is the pregnant patient's treating physician? The abortion provider. And what does "life or health" mean? Roe v. Wade said it is not just the emergency situations that pro-abortionists want you to think about it.

Rather, it includes "emotional, mental, financial, and familial factors that bear on health." In fact, *just last year* abortionists in Ohio argued that abortion is safer than childbirth (obviously not for the baby, but I digress).

So a woman can have an abortion at any time—right up to her due date—if the abortionist himself says that having the baby will make her sadder, sicker, or poorer. And Ohio's abortionists have already told us that they will say so every single time.

And even if the amendment gave the State a meaningful ability to restrict abortion after viability, you should read the definition of "viability" in Section C: "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis." There's that phrase, "pregnant patient's treating physician" again. The abortionist—the person hired to kill the baby—gets to decide "on a case-by-case basis" whether the baby is worthy of protection.

I highly recommended that every Ohioan, before walking into the ballot box in November, take time to read the amendment and think about the legal implications that could come from this.
