THANK YOU & FAREWELL



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



PILLARS OF DOMINICAN LIFE

Today, we celebrate the feast of St. Dominic, the founder of the Order of Preachers and the spiritual father of the friars and sisters who live and serve here at St. Gertrude Church. This year marks the

800th anniversary of his death and his entry into eternal life. As we commemorate this milestone, we can reflect upon the legacy of St. Dominic to his followers and its significance for the parish.

The charism (spiritual gifts) of St. Dominic and the Dominican Order offer a unique manner of preaching the Gospel and bringing people to an encounter with Jesus and the Church. Built upon the Rule of St. Augustine, the religious life that the friars and sisters live informs their preaching, teaching, counsel, administration of the sacraments, and other works of ministry. This religious life has four pillars, which can be embraced by everyone as a way of being associated with the spiritual identity of the Dominicans.

The first pillar is prayer—especially the liturgical prayer of the Church through the celebration of the sacred liturgy and praying the Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office). The Eucharist and the singing of the Psalms orient the life of the Dominican toward God in acts of praise and worship. There is the humble acknowledgement that all we are and everything we have comes from God and rightly ought to be returned to God. This liturgical prayer is a continual immersion in God's work of salvation and redemption. It touches our bodies and our souls. To this communal, liturgical prayer, the Dominicans pray and promote the rosary of Our Lady. The rosary is the cherished prayer of meditation on the words and actions of Jesus and his mother so that we may receive the graces of them. Additionally, Dominican life embraces periods of mental prayer often before the Blessed Sacrament. It is an opportunity for *lectio divina*, spiritual reading, silent reflection, or other devotions.

The second pillar is study. St. Dominic saw study as an opportunity to enlighten the mind and direct the heart toward God. For the Dominican, study is meant to be contemplative. It is a loving exploration of the created world as it reflects the grandeur of God. In order to do this, one's mind must first be informed by Christ, as revealed in sacred Scripture, the teachings of the Church, and the writings of the Church Fathers and the saints. The fruits of study are handed on for the salvation of others through preaching and teaching. Dominicans pay particular attention to the study of St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P., since his works provide a systematic and deeply profound account of creation, human nature, morality, the spiritual life, the mystery of the triune God, and the person of Jesus Christ.

The third pillar is the common life. In his Rule, St. Augustine states that "the chief motivation of sharing life together is to live harmoniously in the house and to have one heart and one soul seeking God." Like the early Christian communities, Dominicans hold everything in common as does a family. In the common life, the friars or sisters pray together, eat meals together, engage in academic dialogue and conferences, recreate together, and complete chores that benefit the well-being of all in the community.

The fourth pillar is the apostolate or preaching. The term "preaching" can be understood in four categories: (1) *catechetical*, which instructs about the faith; (2) *moral*, which exhorts people to live the faith; (3) *apologetic*, which seeks to remove obstacles to faith; 4) *contemplative* (or holy), which seeks to lead the faithful to an encounter with the living God. The apostolate of teaching falls within the apostolate of preaching. The goal is to inform and move the intellect to know the truth and to move the will to an affective and effective love for it.

These four pillars imbue and shape the life of the parish and the ministry of the Dominican friars and sisters. They can also influence family and individual life as a sure path of growing in virtue and holiness. These pillars are what make St. Gertrude Church a Dominican parish. And, on this feast of St. Dominic, it is right and just that we give thanks for all the graces we receive.

Let us love one another and pray for each other,

ASK A DEACON — THE CHARISM OF ST. DOMINIC BY BROTHER DAMIAN MARIE DAY, O.P.

Q: What is the Dominican charism, and how does our parish share in it?

A: Every religious order has a special charism—a particular gift from the Holy

Spirit given to a founder for the good of the Church. An order's charism shapes its form of life, its spirituality, and its type of ministry.

Jesus had grace and holiness in maximal degree—he was "full of grace and truth" (Jn 1:14). All grace comes from him and makes us like him. In theology, we call this Christ's capital grace (or the grace of headship). Just as the head directs and governs the body, so Jesus sanctifies (gives grace to) his body, the Church—"from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace" (Jn 1:16).

A charism is a particular way of receiving and giving that fullness. We can use an analogy. The grace of Jesus is like the light of the sun reflected by different stained glass windows. Some are bright gold; others are deep red. It is the same sun illuminating, but the light is refracted in a variety of dazzling colors. This multiplicity helps to better express the brilliance and power of the sun.

Religious orders and their charisms are like that. The Dominican charism reflects and funnels the grace of Jesus Christ to us in a particular and rich way.

In his letter commemorating the 800th anniversary of St. for one of our Dominican priests to answer in the bulletin!

Dominic's death (August 6, 1221), Pope Francis said that St. Dominic's title "Preacher of Grace" best captures the Dominican charism. The grace given to Dominicans is to preach grace.

But the Dominican charism doesn't mean being a cookie-cutter image of St. Dominic. It means being a son or daughter of St. Dominic. Children are both like and unlike their parents. We see this in the array of Dominican saints who embody the charism of St. Dominic in various ways. Throughout July, we've been exploring these different reflections of the Dominican charism in our Drinking with Dominicans series: the contemplative art of Fra Angelico; the joy of St. Margaret of Castello, even in rejection; the fiery asceticism of St. Catherine of Siena and St. Rose of Lima; the peace of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati in the chaos of everyday life; and the evangelical friendship of St. Dominic. All these saints, in their various walks of life, preached the grace of Jesus Christ.


Through St. Dominic, God has given us a particular way of following Jesus Christ. That charism especially shapes the contours of the lives of Dominican brothers, nuns, and sisters. But it also provides a way of holiness for the laity and for parish communities. Each of us, according to our situations, can be preachers of grace, missionary disciples in a world desperately in need of the truth and mercy of Jesus.
