### **ESCAPING TRAFFIC JAMS**

A couple of weeks ago around 5 p.m., I was driving south on I-71, trying to get through the city and over the bridge into Northern Kentucky. When I first got on the highway, traffic was moving at its expected speed. But as I proceeded further south, I looked down at the maps app on my phone and suddenly saw a lot of "yellow" on the highway ahead of me, which then

became a lot of "red" as I found myself at almost a dead standstill with miles of stopped or barely-moving cars ahead of me.

This is, of course, not the only city where I have experienced the reality known as the "traffic jam." Having lived in or near major cities like Chicago; Washington, D.C.; Baltimore; New York; and Boston, I am quite well acquainted with traffic jams. One thing that has become obvious to me is that most of the larger cities in our country do not have the infrastructure to handle the number of cars trying to navigate their roads.

As I was creeping along at a snail's pace, with every lane already maxed out in vehicles, I couldn't help but look side to side and notice that the on-ramps were also full of cars, all trying to merge into this highway already at its capacity. And almost inevitably, a few hundred yards from the ramp, the merge lane would disappear, forcing this ever-growing mass of cars together. The highway, rather than increasing the number of lanes to accommodate the greater traffic volume, actually decreases the number of lanes!

More and more drivers, all trying to get to the same place, pouring into ever-narrowing roadways. It doesn't take an Einstein to figure out this isn't going to end well. The more people you have trying to get to the same place, and the narrower the roads leading there, the worse the traffic problems will be.

But there is one exception to this rule. There is one journey, one great "commute," where this is not the case. And that is our journey to heaven.

Like many of the highways in our cities, the road that leads to heaven is indeed a narrow one, as Jesus himself taught us (Matthew 7:13-14). But that is where the parallel with city traffic ends. Because on the road to heaven, our fellow travelers do not "get in the way." When someone "pulls ahead" of us in holiness, that doesn't hold us back. Indeed, quite often, having those around us making progress on the journey to heaven will help and inspire us to work harder to grow in holiness ourselves. This is one of the deep truths about growing in the spiritual life that I've learned over the years: it is much easier to do so when one is surrounded by people who are all striving for it as well. The "momentum" created by others helps to carry us along, strengthening our faith and reminding us we have many brothers and sisters on this very same journey.

So the next time you are sitting in the midst of snarled traffic, whether on I-71 going through the city or even waiting in the pickup line at St. Gertrude School at the end of the school day (!!!), recall Jesus' teaching about the narrow road rather than let frustration get the better of you. And always remember: there are no traffic jams on the way to heaven. God bless,

### WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



### THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

#### THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

#### **PUTS WOMEN AT RISK**

Current Ohio laws\* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

### ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,\*\* "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortion-providing physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

#### IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

### **ARTICLE I, SECTION 22**

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.


