The following article by Father Earl Fernandes appeared in the August 2021 edition of The Catholic Telegraph Magazine. Father Earl offers a unique perspective on the Beacons of Light process, and I thought it was worth sharing.

A PRIEST'S PERSPECTIVE: THE CHURCH AS THE FAMILY OF GOD

The Church is a sign and instrument of communion with God and of unity among all men and women who are called to bring the joy of the Gospel to the whole world. One scriptural image used by the Second Vatican Council which may be helpful for understanding the forthcoming parish groupings and the *Beacons of Light* process is that of the Church as the Family of God — "the house of God in which His family dwells; the household of God in the Spirit" (cf. Eph. 2:19, 22).

The image of the Church as a family is ancient, and the idea of a family as a "domestic church" has re-emerged in recent times. Parishes are communities of families, gathered under a pastor, a "father" of the family, in communion with the bishop, to worship God and to build the Kingdom. The family is a place of belonging, a privileged place to experience love and growth, an original sign of Christ's love for His Church, given to us by God the Father. It is both a building block of society and a critical means by which we are introduced into a decisive relationship with God.

The family exists to generate life and deepen the companionship between believers as they journey toward their common destiny. Family stability is critical for the future. This is true not only of our individual families, but also of our parish families. Every family, including a parish family, has a mission to build up the Church and increase the Kingdom of God in the world; to be a community of love in which people experience a sense of belonging; and, to be a beacon of light and hope to others.

In the Family of God we continually meet and encounter Christ who, according to Pope Benedict XVI in Deus caritas est, "gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." In our personal families, we learn to confront difficulties and face the realities of life, enlightened by His Presence. In family life, we encounter Christ in each other. In both our individual families and parish families, our companionship comes together in a space, in our daily living and working together, on a common journey with a common goal: our destiny with God.

The Church can be understood as the Family of God. Jesus addresses God as Father and the early Church addressed its members as adelphoi (brothers and sisters). The Church is not principally an administrative grouping, organized and occasionally re-organized like a company; rather, its distinctive characteristics are prayer and the Eucharist. Believers are called by name to be part of this family and are drawn together and constituted as a family by the Holy Spirit. No family is perfect, and there are always members of the family with different temperaments, but there is one fundamental bond: faith.

The Church, constituted by God, is mandated to evangelize. Every family and every parish must have a missionary outlook. We must


radiate Christ to the world, and yet, we are experiencing profound change, which makes the task of evangelizing more challenging. Pope Francis frequently says, "we live not so much in an epoch of change as in a change of epoch." Acknowledging this and the current reality of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, which includes demographic shifts and fewer priests, it is essential to adapt to effectively carry out the Church's mission in a changed environment.

Beacons of Light is not principally about a priest shortage; it is

about the mission of evangelization. At the beginning of his Pontificate, Pope Francis described his dream for the Church in The Joy of the Gospel: "I dream of a 'missionary option,' that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation."

I invite you to dream about how our parishes can be evangelizing communities, beacons that radiate the light of faith and respond to the needs of the whole Family of God.



THE LITURGY: PRAYING, BELIEVING, LIVING

Part two in an 8-part series

Basic Beginnings

We began our consideration of the liturgy with one of the most fundamental parts of our lives: the Sign of the Cross.

Have you thought about the Sign of the Cross throughout this last week? Have you thought about how often we make the Sign of the Cross during the day? Have you considered *how* you make the Sign of the Cross? If someone were watching you, could they tell by the way you make the Sign of the Cross that, through this action, you are recalling the very foundation of our life of faith?

If the Sign of the Cross has such significance, what other fundamental parts of life do you think might have a much greater importance than we might think? Think for a moment . . . You walk into church, place your hand in the holy water font, make the Sign of the Cross with the fingers of your right hand, walk to your pew, genuflect, kneel down, and begin to say your prayers. What greatness and beauty is found in the "language" of our hands? Have you ever thought that we carry our souls in our hands? Walking: We walk all day long. Hospitals will have signs posted throughout different surgical units, "walk to the cure." How do we walk to our pew or in the Communion procession? Do we walk toward our pew or down the aisle with the awareness that this is our taking our place in the great procession of life, and ultimately our walk into the new and eternal Jerusalem?

Monsignor Guardini writes, "Walking is the outward make of man's essential and peculiar nobility. It is the privilege of man alone to walk erect, his movement is his own power and choice. The upright carriage denotes the human being!" How do you and I walk forward to receive Our Lord in holy Communion? Are our minds and hearts centered upon the great gift we are about to receive? At the visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth, Elizabeth proclaims, "and who am I that the Mother of my Lord should come to me?" Is our procession, our walking to the Communion rail so directed that the same words might be found on our lips and in our hearts?

Getting to the Heart of the Matter

How can considering the Sign of the Cross, our hands, or the way we walk, genuflect, or kneel lead us from prayer, to believing, to living? And how does it teach us about the liturgy? Very simply: we bring our bodies to the worship of God—and through our bodies, begin to experience the transcendence of God and the eternal wedding feast that the liturgy prefigures.
