
<u>HELPING US ASSESS</u> WHERE WE ARE AS A PARISH AND A SCHOOL

As these last days of August give way to September, our parish and school are once again buzzing with activity. Teachers and children are back in the classrooms, fall sports are well under way, and the various parish faith formation programs have either already begun or are about to

in the weeks ahead. I think all would agree that it feels good to have a school year beginning in a "normal" way, unhindered by the COVID protocols that had become a part of all of our lives through 2020 and 2021. Indeed, the impact of the pandemic on our parish and school have made these last several years difficult ones (as they have been for everyone in our world). There have been other challenges we at St. Gertrude have faced over these last years, as well, including the change in pastors and both parish and school personnel turnover. There has also been a shift in the makeup of our parish as a whole since the pre-COVID days.

In addition to that, this fall, our parish kicks off a year of preparation (and celebration) for the upcoming 100th anniversary of our parish, which will happen in November of 2023. This last year of our first century of existence places us on the threshold of our second century of life as a parish.

In light of all of these factors, we are beginning a process of



assessment and strategic planning which involves and invites the participation of the entire parish and school community. We have hired an organization called the Institute for School and Parish Development (ISPD) to work with us in a comprehensive assessment of the school and parish. We believe the Holy Spirit is leading us to truly evaluate what we do well and what we could be doing better as a parish and school family. Once the assessment is completed later this fall, the next step would be to engage many of our parish and school individuals and families in a comprehensive strategic planning process that will help chart the course for our parish and school over the years ahead. More information about that process will be forthcoming later on this year.

In the short term, there is one very critical way in which everyone can help with the assessment process. In the next few weeks, every registered parish household and every school family will be receiving a brief email survey. We ask everyone who receives this to *please* take the time to read the questions and respond to them honestly and in as much detail as you are able. We want to know what you believe we are doing well, learn from you what you identify as our current challenges, and hear any ideas you might have for the future. For those who do not have access to email, there will be a limited number of paper surveys that will be made available at the Sunday Masses one of the upcoming weekends. The more responses we receive, the more accurate a picture we will have of where we are standing at this moment in time. That, in turn, will help us in the process of discerning where it is the Lord is leading us in the future.

Thank you, in advance, for assisting in this process. We are looking forward to the great things we know the Lord will be doing at St. Gertrude in the years ahead. God bless,

MEET THE TEAM: JIM ANDRUS



<u>ASK A PRIEST</u> GUARDIAN ANGELS

FATHER JOACHIM KENNEY, O.P. Q: When do we receive a guardian angel? A: Angels are the ministers and messengers of God and are pure spiritual beings. In his Divine Providence, God assigns an angel to each person to guard and help him or her. This doctrine has been taught

from the earliest days of the Church. We find scriptural support for it in Genesis 48:16, Matthew 18:10, and Acts 12:15. Many Fathers of the Church, such as St. Basil the Great and Origen, also wrote about guardian angels.

The established teaching of the Church is that we all receive a guardian angel at birth. At first, very few argued that we did not get an angel until Baptism, since that is when we become God's children in grace. But, it was determined that the gift of an angel guardian was one that God attached to rationality and thus grants to each human person. That being said, however, it was the general consensus among the Fathers and theologians that our guardian angel takes on a more important role after Baptism. The grace of Christ in our souls makes us more docile to their inspirations and guidance and so they can be of more help to us. They are much more able to instruct us in virtue, protect us from troubles, reprimand us when we fall into sin, and assist us in prayer.

Some might wonder why we do not receive a guardian angel before birth while we are still in our mother's womb. Believe it or not, St. Thomas Aquinas considered this question. He argued that the unborn child is still so closely united to its mother that he falls under the protection of the mother's guardian angel.

The Church encourages each of us to develop a relationship with our guardian angel. We can speak to them and ask their help and intercession just as we do the saints. Now would be a great time



to start working on that, as the feast of the Guardian Angels is coming up on October 2.


