
PENITENTIAL ACT


READING II 2 Timothy 1:8b–10


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

And so, with the Powers of heaven, we worship you constantly on earth, and before your majesty without end we acclaim:







All kneel


The celebrant continues with the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, the celebrant sings:

Amen.





In your goodness, show favor to Zion; rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. Then you will be pleased with lawful sacrifice, burnt offerings wholly consumed; then you will be offered young bulls on your altar.
