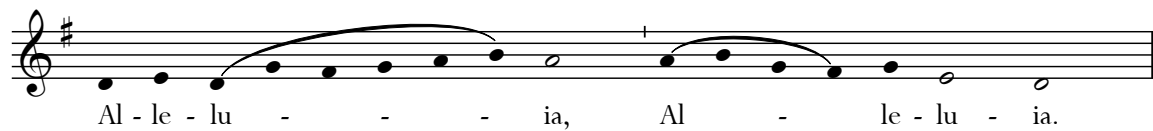



The mystery of faith.



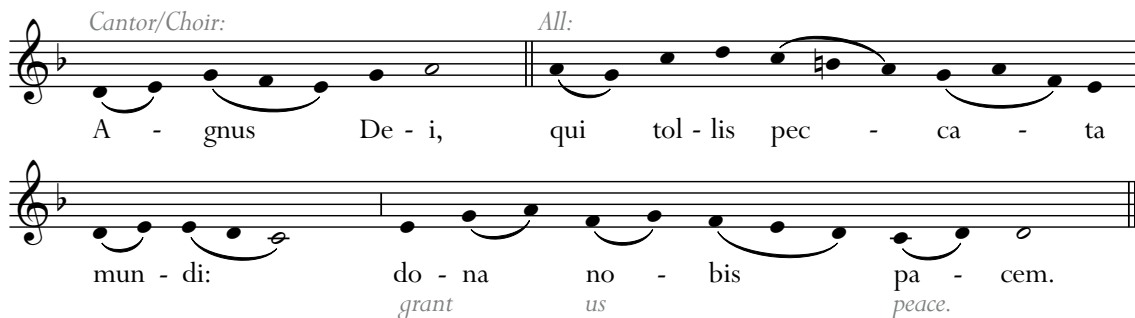
