Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.



May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen.**


KYRIE, ELEISON

The choir sings each verset once, then all repeat.



When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.





And with your spirit.


Lift up your hearts.



All kneel


The celebrant continues with the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words of Consecration, the celebrant sings:

Amen.



May the wondrous flame that appeared above the disciples, powerfully cleanse your hearts from every evil and pervade them with its purifying light.


